
# Mark your Calendars for Children's Christmas Activities

#### Come Alive Spirituality Sunday Morning Adult Class

This Fall's Theme: Seeing God in the Face of Each Other.: An exploration of racism, power and the transforming love of God.

The spiritual journey is a journey into wholeness, a journey that calls us to an honest self-examination of those things in our own lives that separate us from God, from others, and from our own True Self.

The gospel of Jesus calls us to seek God in the face of others, the outcast, the stranger, the neighbor, the "other." Utilizing a title from an Episcopalian study course, *Seeing God in the Face of Each Other*, we will explore personal, interpersonal, institutional and systemic levels of racism in our own lives. We do not do this work alone and can only do it with God as our companion and guide. Join us on a transformative walk every Sunday morning beginning September 10, at 9:45 a.m. in room L3 with the Rev. Margaret Rush Hankins and John Morrison as class facilitators. No book is assigned, but handouts will be distributed throughout the course, supplemented by videos and other materials. 
### Celebrating Forty-Two Years of Hope
